Objective

To utilize art, storytelling, organizing and my lived experience with the criminal legal system to connect with my people, specifically, marginalized and ostracized community members. My purpose is to build a movement of healers, organizers, and artists that will collectively work to disrupt, dismantle, and abolish oppressive systems that have historically caused harm, inflicted trauma, and divested from Black and Brown communities. I intend to use every resource within me to build power so that we can collectively and effectively create a world we all can thrive in and where black and brown people aren't bound by white supremacy or capitalism. We know that in order for that to become a reality we must be committed to interpersonal and societal transformation. Two systems must be addressed: The oppressive system that we live in and our central nervous system. We must build a strong movement body while simultaneously moving our bodies. Organizing, Healing Justice, Transformative Justice, and Restorative Justice is the path toward liberation. .

- **Some Things Must Be Heard: Spitting & Politicking 2022 -2026**

- **Became a fiscally sponsored project 10/10 /25**

- Some Things Must Be Heard: Spitting & Politicking is a Black-Led, art-centered, movement-building initiative that merges art, advocacy, spirituality, and embodied organizing to ignite transformation. We create spaces where currently & formerly incarcerated, systems impacted people's voices are uplifted. Our base of cultural organizers will use their art to mobilize community members, shift public narrative, dismantle systems of oppression, embrace joy, and give vision to a transformed world.
 - *My primary responsibilities are to handle all of the day to day operations, fundraising, and the overall financial management of the project in collaboration with the fiscal sponsor. This includes managing budgets, ensuring legal compliance, and complying with the sponsor's policies and procedures. As the project director, I ensure all the activities align with our mission and the funder's guidelines. This includes facilitating meetings, training, outreach, social media management , strategic planning, working closely with our advisory committee, meeting with stakeholders and partners, developing membership models, and leading healing sessions.*
 - From 2022 to 2025, Some Things Must Be Heard; Spitting & Politicking was a spoken word community building platform that featured revolutionary artists and community organizers who were committed to speaking truth to power and healing to the heart. We used art to uplift campaigns, social justice issues, and to move people into action. Through this platform we have impacted over 4000 people and financially supported artists, organizers, venue owners, photographers, videographers and DJ's with our personal funds.
 - **NOMOREJAILDEATHS Campaign**
 - We are currently a part of the No More Jail Deaths Campaign which is a campaign that was created, informed and led by currently incarcerated organizers to address the deadly and inhumane jail conditions. I was involved with this campaign from 2020 - 2024 in my role with the Freedom Community Center. We officially joined as a coalition partner recently.

- **Director of Movement Building and Storytelling**

- **The Freedom Community Center September 2022 - September 2024**
 - *My primary responsibility was stewarding Freedom Community Center efforts in community movement building through leadership development, organizing, partnerships and city and state-based advocacy. I supported the Executive Director in the development of a multi-year power-building strategy and work plans to build a survivor-centered Black liberation movement focused on transformative justice in addition to managing the*

Movement Building efforts of FCC. My secondary responsibility as the Director was to align FCCs movement of survivors with coalitions in St. Louis City and across the state to move forward key advocacy priorities identified in the power-building strategy. Lastly as the Director, I was responsible for developing and implementing FCC led advocacy efforts to shrink the size and scope of the legal system and invest those resources into the North St. Louis community.

○ **Campaigns and Programs**

■ **Power Builders & PeaceMaking**

- *Our work at FCC began with building power in Black and poor communities most affected by the trauma of systemic oppression in North St. Louis. Our organizers canvas streets in neighborhoods such as College Hill, Fairgrounds, O'Fallon, Hyde Park, Jeff Vander Lou, and the Ville. We highlighted the voices of those directly impacted by violence and supported them in developing their leadership as they fight for durable policy change. Every second and fourth Thursday, we hosted the "We Keep Us Safe - Power Builders Meeting," which gathers Black and poor survivors of violence in North St. Louis. At these meetings and in our canvassing efforts, we educate, share resources, build relationships and politicize people to take action against the systems of punishment and control most notably the police, prosecution and incarceration machines.*

■ **N.O.W (New Opportunities for Wellness)**

- *We partnered with the Black Healer Collective and Power 4 STL to introduce the second iteration of the New Opportunities for Wellness (NOW) which is a community healing initiative for neighborhoods that have experienced high rates of violence. Healing must extend beyond those hit by the bullets to include the communities in which the bullets are fired. NOW nurtured community members' power to create spaces of healing and well-being in those neighborhoods. We recruited and trained community healers on wellness and healing techniques to recover from their own trauma and respond to their neighbors.*

■ **FCC Court Watch STL**

- *Since June 2021 members of FCC courtwatch have borne witness to the systemic injustices of the pretrial process, arbitrary bail requests, and the unjust pretrial detention of people legally presumed innocent in the 22nd Judicial Circuit in St. Louis, MO. To date we have watched over 3,000 court hearings collecting data which we publish to expose the violence that is occurring and to hold our Courts, Judges & Prosecutors accountable to the People. We also told the stories that otherwise would go untold.*

■ **No More Jail Deaths**

- *Led or participated in over 10 direct actions demanding an end to jail deaths, investment into our communities, and an end to inhumane pretrial processes. Our strategies were informed by directly impacted people including surviving family members of the people who have lost their lives at CJC, people that are currently detained inside of the facility, and those who have been released from the jail. We organize with survivors and provide mental, emotional and financial support.*

■ **Defund. Re-Envision. Transform Campaign**

- *We were a grassroots campaign which seeks to defund SLMPD, re-envision public safety, and transform St. Louis.*

■ **The People Plan St. Louis**

- *The People's Plan is a comprehensive policy agenda designed to help us build power and redistribute resources in St. Louis city.*

- **Healing Support Specialist & Community Organizer**
- **The Freedom Community Center April 2021 to Sept 2022**
 - *I supported survivors of harm as they traveled along their journey toward healing, restoration, and repair. I worked in collaboration with the survivors to get them to safety, expand their support system and address any barriers that would prevent them from having optimal health. I supported them while they processed through trauma and regained their power. I also worked closely with people who were responsible for harm. I supported them during their healing process and to take accountability. In addition to this role, I was the lead community organizer for the We Keep Us Safe: Power Builders. I was responsible for building a base of survivors of violence so who are committed to meaningfully addressing and intervening in individual and systemic violence. Engaged in door to door canvassing to invited community members to participate in Power Builders meetings, created and facilitated training to expand our political analysis, hosted community events in order to support the community, and connected them to FCC's advocacy campaigns. I was responsible for collecting members' information to maintain the communication database in order to keep community members informed of meetings and/or activities for Power Builders.. I also co-developed our Membership Model and Curriculum with other organizers. Leading our training efforts.*
- **Client Advocate/Bail Disruptor Jan 2020 – April 2021**
- **The Bail Project**
 - *To provide bail assistance for people from marginalized communities that are held in pretrial detention to secure their freedom. Upon release from jail, I provided our clients with emotional and mental support and connected them to local organizations and social services providers to create sustainability within their lives. My role was not only to secure people's release but to disrupt the criminal legal system, and fight mass incarceration. By upholding our holistic model we were able to support clients while they recovered from the collateral consequences of incarceration. I also provided clients with an advocacy platform to fight against this system and expose the problems of the pretrial system that make TBP's work necessary. Ofcourse, this included data collection, court reminders, case management, and story collection and more. The Bail Project was an anchoring organization in the Closed The Workhouse Campaign, which closed the Medium Security Institute in St. Louis, MO*
- **Community Organizer / Volunteer 2019 - 2021**
- **Metropolitan Congregations United Expo St. Louis**
 - *MCU puts faith into action by developing leaders who move their congregations, organizations and communities to change public policy for the common good. Expo is a taskforce of MCU and it's an acronym for Ex-Incarcerated People Organizing. The St. Louis chapter was built on the same structure and training that has been successful in Wisconsin, which is the founding organization. Expo aims to combine lived experiences with the training and knowledge base provided by the Gamelial network to deconstruct the prison industrial complex. Exo's motto is "You have the right to not remain silent." Our goal was to humanize individuals that are currently and previously involved in the criminal legal system. Expo also strives to shift the narrative by highlighting what assets to the community justice impacted individuals can be. During my time, we worked on the Unlock the Vote Campaign, Uplifted the Voices of CJC detainees while they were fighting to survive COVID 19 and harsh conditions, and Holding the Dismas House Accountable for the inhumane treatment, unsafe environment, and deplorable conditions of their facility.*
